Long-Term Care Illness Examples

Critical Illness - A life-threatening condition that requires immediate pharmacological and/or medical support of vital organ functions otherwise death would be imminent.

Critical Illness Examples

- Heart Attack
- Paralysis
- Kidney Failure
- Stroke
- Major burns covering at least 20% of the body
- Major Organ Transplant
- Loss of Limbs
- Some forms of Cancer
- Motor Neuron Disease (MND)

Chronic Illness - Conditions that typically last a year or more and require ongoing medical attention. Depending on severity, the condition may reduce or limit activities of daily living.

Chronic Illness Examples

- Multiple Sclerosis
- Cystic Fibrosis
- Diabetes
- Arthritis
- Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
- Asthma
- Heart Disease
- Crohn's Disease
- Alzhiemers
- Hypertension
- Some forms of Mental illness

Terminal Illness - An individual who has been certified by a physician as having an illness or physical condition which can reasonably be expected to result in death within 24 months or less.

Terminal Illness Examples

- Advanced Stage Cancer
- Liver Disease
- Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS)
- Dementia
- HIV and AIDS
- Coma
- Pulmonary Disease
- Parkinson's
